Re: Meeting Minutes – March 21, 2019 discussion of HB 1247

A telephonic meeting of the CLC's Legislative Subcommittee was held on March 21, 2019, to discuss HB 1247. Participating in the call in addition to the chair were CLC members: Fred Barnes, Barry Kalmanson, Bruce Partington, and Robert Worman. The general agreement of the subcommittee was that the legislation should be opposed and that recommendation would be made to the CLC.

Also, Barry Kalmanson stated that the version of the bill that would be considered in committee on Monday would be significantly different and remove some of the concerns. The subcommittee specifically noted the following as to the proposed legislation:
