Safety Tip: Credit Cards

- Protect yourself in the event of theft or loss of credit cards by keeping photocopies of both the backs and the fronts of each of the credit cards you own. In the event of theft or loss, you will then have all the numbers you need to call and cancel the cards. Keep the copies in a safe and secure place.
- Instead of signing the backs of your cards, consider writing the words, "Ask for ID" on the back. Cashiers will need to see a picture ID that corresponds to the name of the card holder.
- Never write your PIN on the back of your card or on a piece of paper in your wallet. Also, shield the screen while punching your PIN into ATMs and be sure to keep or destroy the receipt that is printed at the termination of your transaction. Do not leave it in the wastebasket at the ATM!
