No one enjoys or deserves abuse. A person's reasons for staying in an abusive relationship are many and varied. It may be dangerous to leave the abuser (women face a dramatic increase in serious injury and murder when leaving an abusive relationship). There may also be financially dependent upon the abusive partner, or fear losing their children. Lack of resources, institutional responses, and traditional thinking may also create barriers for leaving.

Safety Tip Email:



All of us who have email accounts receive unsolicited email or "spam." We also receive unbelievably good offers from companies, banks, and other businesses. But remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. No respected bank will email you asking for your account number and social security number—they already have that information if you have an account with them. Do not email anyone social security or bank account numbers. We wary of ordering medications in the mail—particularly "mood enhancement" herbal or "OTC" medications. These are often either useless placebos or, worse, unregulated, unresearched, and potentially dangerous drugs. As a rule of thumb, do not email any information you would not want the whole world to know.
