



## Latah County Sheriff's Office Hot Sheet

### April 19 through April 25, 2005

#### Civil Papers:

- 34 Subpoenas and/or criminal summonses were served
- 3 No Contact Order was served
- 14 Other civil papers were served
- 4 Warrants were served

#### Arrests:

- On 04/19/2005, at about 15:20, deputies found approximately six grams of marijuana on two Moscow men (on 23 years of age and the other 34). The deputies had responded to one of the men's homes after a report of suspicious drug activity.
- On 04/19/2005, at about 01:33, a Denver, CO, man was arrested for DWP after a traffic stop for driving at an excessive rate of speed on Hwy. 95 between Moscow and Genesee.
- On 04/21/2005, a 19 year old Moscow woman was cited for criminal trespassing after driving her vehicle in a cultivated field on West Twin Road.
- On 04/22/2005, at about 02:00, deputies stopped a vehicle at milepost 341 on Hwy. 95 for failing to dim high-beam headlights to oncoming traffic. During the course of the stop, Kilo, Latah County's drug dog alerted deputies to the presence of drugs. Both occupants of the vehicle, a 21 year old Carson City, NV, man and an 33 year old Yreka, CA, man were arrested for both drug possession and possession of paraphernalia.
- On 04/23/2005, at about 21:15, deputies responded to a domestic violence report in Potlatch and arrested a 33 year old Potlatch man for Domestic Battery.
- On 04/24/2005, at about 01:15, after an altercation at the Elk Tavern in Bovill, a 40 year old Deary man and a 45 year old Bovill man were cited for Disturbing the Peace.



#### Alternatives to Violence Domestic Violence Statistics:

- Every 9 seconds a woman in the United States is beaten—usually by her male partner (DOJ, 2002).
- 22-35% of women who visit emergency rooms are there for injuries related to ongoing partner abuse (JAMA, 1992).
- In 1998, 1,830 murders were attributed to intimate partners (Rennison, 2000)

#### Safety Tip Meth

Methamphetamine is a dangerous stimulant drug that affects the Central Nervous System. But it isn't just those who take the drug that can be casualties of meth culture. Meth production entails using several chemicals that when combined can be very toxic and even explosive. If you suspect a meth lab in your neighborhood, **do not** attempt to explore it on your own. Call your local law enforcement agency and report any suspicious activity that you see. Keep a safe distance away from the home you suspect. Record (in a notebook) any activity you think is suspicious including times and dates of the activity so you can be a good witness for law enforcement. Be safe!
