Arrests:

- On 4/6/2005, at about 09:44, a 31 year old Moscow man was cited for having brought a controlled substance into the jail. He had been initially arrested by another agency on other charges.
- On 04/07/2005, at about 23:55, a 21 year old Troy man was arrested for DUI after driving erratically on Highway 8 between Moscow and Troy. He was released from the jail after registering a BAC below the legal limit.
- On 04/07/2005, at about 18:44, a 28 year old Golva, ND, man was cited for criminal trespassing after driving in a cultivated field north of Darby Road.
- On 04/08/2005, at 02:36, a 33 year old Moscow man was arrested in Moscow for possession of a controlled substance and paraphernalia.

Alternatives to Violence Sexual Assault Statistics:

1 in 4 women are sexually assaulted in their lifetime, with over half of these assaults happening before the age of 18 (*Sexual Assault Report, August 2003*).

1 in 6 men are sexually victimized, with 83% of abused boys being under the age of 12 (Hooper, 1998). 84% of all sexual assaults are committed by someone the victim knows (NWS, 1992). 93% of children that were sexually assaulted knew their attacker (DOJ, 2000).

No one deserves to be assaulted.
Sexual assault is a crime and the perpetrator is the one to blame.*

Safety Tip: Fundraisers

A lot of schools, service organizations, and clubs have children selling fundraising items door to door.



Although this is a great opportunity for those groups to raise money, selling things door to door can be dangerous if certain safety rules are not observed. Before you send your child out to raise money for his/her group, be sure he/she knows these rules:

- Unless both you and your parents know someone well, do not step into his/her house. Remain on the porch or front steps.
- Make sure that you know the exact route your child is taking and which houses he/she will visit.
- If your child is going out alone, have him/her bring a cell phone in case of emergency.
- Safety in numbers: although they might not make as many individual sales, it is always safer to send kids out in groups of two or more.

Remember, the safest thing you can do is go with your children when they sell items for fundraisers! Be safe.
