- ***Penstemon fruticosus* (Shrubby penstemon), 10" pot** (*Photo below. Although through blooming for the year, it will be covered with bloom again in following years, in mid to late spring*) Donated by Thad Davis.
Low-growing evergreen shrub to 12" tall, best in sun, occasional watering once established. Prefers well-drained soil and is suitable for a rockery. Very showy with bluish-purple flowers forming a dense mass above foliage. Forms large clumps from stem rooting, but easily managed. May be cut back to lowest buds every 3 or 4 years to promote new growth and flowers. Propagate from seed, late spring cuttings or divisions. Attracts bumblebees, all sizes. **OR**
