PETITION FOR INTESTATE PROBATE, APPOINTING ADMINISTRATOR, GRANTING NPs, AND DECLARING SOLVENCY (RCW 11.20.020 & 11.68.011)

Petitioner, ACE HAYNES, declares under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington that the following is true and correct to the best of his knowledge:

1. <u>JURISDICTION</u>. DIANE G. HAYNES, (hereinafter "Decedent Diane Haynes") died intestate on February 14, 2014, leaving property in the State of Washington subject to probate. Decedent Diane Hayes was married at the time of her death to Dennis H. Haynes.

DENNIS H. HAYNES, (hereinafter "Decedent Dennis Haynes") died intestate on August 19, 2014, leaving property in the State of Washington subject to probate.

- 2. <u>LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT</u>. Decedent Diane Haynes died leaving no Will. Decedent Dennis Haynes died leaving no Will.
- 3. <u>ADMINISTRATOR</u>. The Petitioner is Decedent Diane Haynes' and Decedent Dennis Haynes' son. Petitioner is a resident of the State of Washington and is willing and legally qualified to act as the administrator.
- 4. HEIRS AND BENEFICIARIES. Decedent Diane Haynes had a child from a prior marriage, Jesse Coleman. The Decedents had one child (Ace Haynes) together and were married at the time of the death of Diane Haynes. Dennis Haynes had just the one son and was not married, having widowed, at the time of his death. The names, addresses, relationship of each heir, legatee, devisee, beneficiary or transferee of Decedents are as follows:

5. <u>ESTATE SOLVENCY</u>. The value of Decedent Diane Haynes' assets at death exceeded the value of her liabilities by at least \$40,000, so Decedent Diane Haynes died solvent.

The value of Decedent Dennis Haynes assets at death exceeded the value of his liabilities by at least \$100,000, so Decedent Dennis Haynes died solvent. Furthermore, the value of all expenses of the estate, including taxes and fees and costs of

administration, should not exceed \$10,000.00 so both Decedents' estates are now and should remain solvent.

- Petitioner requests that the Court waive bond in this estate. 6. BOND. Petitioner is the son of the Decedents. The Petitioner requests the Court waive any requirement to post bond.
- 7. NOTICE. No Notice of this hearing is required pursuant to RCW 11.68.041. More than forty (40) days have passed since the death of both Decedents.

REQUEST TO COURT. Petitioner requests that the court determine and order that:

- The Intestate estate be opened for both Decedents jointly as they were 1. husband and wife and died within months of each other.
- Confirm ACE HAYNES, as Administrator, to serve without bond, and 2. without court intervention; and
- 3. Issue Letters of Administration to the Administrator upon the filing of his Oath;
 - 4. Declare the Estates to be solvent.
